In November 2016 the EU Committee on Employment and Social Affairs drafted a no holds barred opinion on CETA, to the EU Committee on International Trade. It made it clear that CETA will:

- negatively impact on the EU's 20.9 million SME's (small-medium employers)
- privilege investors over labour rights, and will
